	<b>Section 1</b>	<b>Walks Forward x3, Kick, Walks Back x3, Touch.</b>		
	1 - 2	Step right forward. Step left forward.	Forward, 2,	Forward
	3 - 4	Step right forward. Kick left forward.	3, Kick	
	5 - 6	Step left back. Step right back.	Back, 2,	Back
	7 - 8	Step left back. Touch right beside left.	3, Touch	
	<b>Section 2</b>	<b>Side, Together, Right Chasse, Back Rock, Side, Behind.</b>		
	1 - 2	Step right to right side. Step left beside right.	Side Together	Right
	3 & 4	Step right to right side. Close left beside right. Step right to right side.	Side Close Side	
	5 - 6	Rock back onto left. Recover forward onto right.	Back Rock	On the spot

3 & 4	Step left 1/4 turn left. Step right beside left. Step left forward.	Turn Shuffle	Turning left	
5 & 6	Kick right forward. Step right beside left. Step left in place.	Kick Ball Change	On the spot	
7 & 8	Kick right forward. Step right beside left. Step left in place.	Kick Ball Change
