Ragpicker's Christmas

48 count, 2 wall, improver level Choreographer: Phil Johnson (UK) Oct 2007 Choreographed to: Ragpicker's Dream Mark Knopfler CD Ragpicker's Dream (120 bpm); Silent Night by Jewel, CD: Christmas Hits

24 count intro (12 count intro for Silent Night)

Dance in groups of four with one facing 6 0'clock; one facing 12 0'clock; one facing 3 0'clock and the last facing 9 0'clock. Start holding each others right hand in the centre of the group at arms length. (Quadrille style). Also works as a partner dance.

Left and Right Shuffles Forward x 2 (to make a circular full turn right to return to your original position)

- 1-3 Step left forward (to left diagonal), step right beside left, step forward on left (starting to turn to right diagonal)
- 4-6 Step right forward (turning to right diagonal), step left beside right, step forward on right (starting to turn to left diagonal)
- 7-9 Step left forward (to left diagonal), step right beside left, step forward on left (starting to turn to right diagonal)
- 10-12 Step right forward (starting to turn to face the wall you started from), step left forward, (facing wall you started from), step right in place

Basic Waltz Forward on Left and Basic Waltz Back on Right x 2 (Hands get raised upwards as you meet in the middle and back down as you waltz back)

- 13-15 Step left forward, rock onto right beside left, step on left in place
- 16-18 Step right back, rock onto left beside right, step on right in place
- 19-21 Step left forward, rock onto right beside left, step on left in place
- 22-24 Step right back, rock onto left beside right, step on right in place

(let go of hands) Basic Left Waltz forward to left Diagonal, $\frac{1}{4}$ turn left Basic Right Waltz Backwards (now facing opposite wall from where you started) x 2 (returning to wall you started from)

- 25-27 1/4 turn left stepping left forward, rock on right to right side, recover weight on left;
- 28-30 ¼ turn left stepping back on right, rock left to left side, recover weight on right;
- 31-33 ¼ turn left stepping left forward, rock on right to right side, recover weight on left;
- 34-36 ¼ turn left stepping back on right, rock left to left side, recover weight on right.

Note:- as you $\frac{1}{8}$ turn you should start by moving to the wall on a diagonal (about an $\frac{1}{8}$ Turn left to start) and then square up to the wall for the second step of the basic waltz step to complete the $\frac{1}{4}$ turn so the feet are moving in a diamond shape pattern for counts 25-36.

Note: Dance ends on count 30 (during wall ten) when you are back in your original starting position and as the music fades Bow/curtsey to your partners on counts of three (12 0'clock and 6 0'clock to each other/ 9 and 3 to each other; Then 12 to 3/ 6 to 9 and finally 12to 9 and 6 to 3; wishing each a happy Christmas as you go round.

(hold right hands again) Basic Left Waltz into Middle (raising hands); $\frac{1}{4}$ turn Right Basic Right Waltz back x2

- 37-39 Step left forward, rock onto right beside left, step on left on place
- 40-42 ¼ turn right stepping back on right, rock onto left beside right, step on right in place
- 43-45 Step left forward, rock onto right beside left, step on left on place
- 46-48 ¼ turn right stepping back on right, rock onto left beside right, step on right in place (to end facing the opposite wall you started from)

Variations:

1. For the more advanced you may like to try having two groups of four dancers close to each other with the 12 o'clock and 6 o'clock facing dancers from each group changing places during section3 (counts 28-30).

Moving from your 6 0'clock position you meet the opposite 12 o'clock dancer at your 9 and his/her 3 o'clock (counts 25-27) Turning about 1/8 right weave backwards (front side behind) into the 6 o'clock position in the other group and then waltz round to end up as that group's 12 o'clock.

That groups 12 0'clock doing the same into your group's 12 o'clock position and then waltzing round to 6 o'clock. Thus making this more of a traditional Quadrille style of dance. For a bit of style on count 27/28 why not touch palms of right hand together as you cross and turn 1/8 right. It may be better if the dancers were so set up as to have boy girl crossing each time....getting complicated now!

2. Now for the really clever show offs why not try placing all groups of four in a circle (need a huge floor) and have 12 and 6 o' clock dancers in all groups changing places!!!!!

Music Note; During Walls 8 and 9 the music for Ragpicker's Dream fades for a few beats. Just keep dancing at the same waltz tempo and when it comes back you will be on the right beat.

Silent Night ends on wall 6 at count 13-15 so you will be close together to wish each other a happy Christmas as the music fades. For this music its best danced under the Mistletoe!
